SNOW EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

By City ordinance, in the event of a “Snow Emergency”, residents have three hours to remove their vehicles from the streets. Police officers are authorized to tow or affix a citation to any vehicle parked on a City street during this time. Please cooperate when a Snow Emergency is declared, in the interest of public safety, so that police, fire, and ambulance vehicles can safely and quickly access each residence and place of business in the City.

Snow emergencies are declared through local media, and an email is sent to everyone on the City's email listing. You may sign up for the email list on the City's website at www.fortwright.com, scroll down on the left side of the screen under the menu, where you will find the link to sign up for emails.
